The house is located in the south of the vast 'Morvan regional park', a protected nature reserve of 281,400 hectares in Burgundy.

In this hilly and wooded region, the babbling brooks and rolling meadows are particularly typical. Old oak trees shelter the numerous Charolais cows. The natural hedges and the numerous wild flowers give the landscape an extra colour. The old villages and stone farms offer an atmosphere of authenticity and past glory.

The outdoors, the connection with nature and the silence are special in this unspoiled region.

The old farmhouse has been renovated and equipped with all modern comforts. It is suitable for two people.

The sunny garden offers a panoramic view and you can relax in the shade of an old orchard.

The wood stove is central in the living room. The old fireplace immediately emphasizes the authenticity of the house. The living room, the wooden floor and other charming details create a warm atmosphere.

The comfortable kitchen is equipped with a gas stove, an oven and a refrigerator. Everything is set up to serve a Burgundian meal. You will also find a kettle, a Nespresso machine, a coffee maker and a blender. The kitchen also has solid dishes, cooking equipment and basic products.

There is also a wood stove in the dining room. This provides a warm comfort in spring and fall. The old French tiles give the dining room an extra touch.

In the bathroom, you can enjoy a wonderful and spacious shower.

From the dining room, you climb to the upper floor. The loft leads you to the spacious bedroom. A comfortable and freshly made double bed (160x200) awaits you.

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Activities

From Anemone Sauvage, you can walk, cycle for hours, but also lounge in the hammock. In the wider area, you will find a range of cultural activities and you can sniff out old crafts. The Morvan will also surprise you culinary with its regional products.

1. Pleasure of cycling and walking

From Anemone Sauvage you can go on beautiful walks and there are many marked hiking trails in the area. You can walk for hours without meeting anyone. A real breath of fresh air for nature lovers!

Cyclists also get their money's worth. The racing bike and the mountain bike will take you on beautiful roads. With its 2300 km of marked trails, the Morvan can claim to be the largest mountain bike area in France.

2. Fun on the water

If you, as a nature lover, also enjoy paddle surfing or other water sports, you will certainly appreciate the Lac de Pannencière and the Lac de Settons. Both reservoirs are located in the heart of the Morvan and are perfect for a refreshing swim on a hot summer day.

You can go canoeing, among other things. On the river Arroux, you will sail about 11 km downstream through a breath-taking natural area.

Fishing enthusiasts will also be able to practice their passion along the most beautiful spots of the numerous rivers, lakes and ponds.

3. Cities

Autun is an ancient Roman city where you can still find a lot of Roman heritage. The temple of Janus, the ancient ramparts, the Roman theatre and the city gates are living proof. Autun has a beautiful cathedral. The cathedral Saint-Lazarus is known for its sculpture. This is located in the old medieval part of the city with beautiful streets and views.

Beaune is a city with many buildings dating from the Middle Ages and the Renaissance. The city is known for its famous Hôtel-Dieu hospital, the numerous wine shops and restaurants. Beaune can be combined with the route des Grands Crus.

Vézelay is a famous place of pilgrimage with a beautiful basilica. It is located on top of a hill in the middle of the town and is still a starting point for the pilgrimage route to Santiago de Compostela. There are many restaurants and stores along the winding road through the town to the basilica.

Nevers is the capital of the department of Nièvre. You will find there the cathedral of Saint-Cyr, a ducal palace and many other churches. The body of Saint Bernadette of Lourdes is deposited in the Saint-Gildard chapel.

Dijon is the capital of Burgundy. It is a historic city with several imposing monuments, a rich history and a lively city centre. Dijon has a long gastronomic tradition. You will find fantastic products and regional specialties, which can be found in the covered market of Les Halles.

Avallon, an old town with a Romanesque church, and Saint Honoré les Bains, in 1900 a very famous spa town with thermal baths still in activity, are worth a visit.

4. Markets & flea markets

If you like flea markets, garage sales and markets, you will be able to enjoy yourself almost every day in spring and in high season. During this period, themed village festivals are also regularly organized: bread festival, blueberry festival, birthday party...

The larger village of Luzy is 15 minutes away by car. Various shops and amenities are available here.





5. Culinary

The Burgundy wine region extends from Dijon in the north to Lyon in the south. It is subdivided from north to south into the following regions: Côte d'Or (Côte de Nuits & Côte de Beaune), Côte Chalonnaise and Mâconnais.

The Route des Grands Crus is one of the most popular wine routes in Burgundy. The route is 60 km long and passes through 37 villages where world famous wines are produced. Chardonnay, Pinot Noir, Gamay & Aligoté are the grape varieties that produce the best wines. Mâcon-Villages, Chablis, Saint-Véran, Sancerre, Pouilly Fuissé,... are some of the names of great wines.

If you love a good glass of wine, tasting is the message!

Savor the Burgundian cuisine, it's possible! The Morvan is the region of the Charolais cow. You see the white cattle grazing everywhere in the green landscape. Tender and juicy flesh, dark red in color. Snails are also in abundance and gingerbread, honey and mustard are local specialties. Local products, traditionally produced, that make you happy!

6. Culture

Nearby is Bibracte on the Mont Beuvray (800m). It is the largest French archaeological center. Here you can see the excavations of the Celtic city of 'Bibracte' with about 10,000 inhabitants at the time, which was confirmed here 2000 years ago. This museum is worth a visit.

Enjoy the magnificent view from the top of Mont Beuvray.

The Temple of a Thousand Buddhas is considered the largest Buddhist temple in Europe, centre of Buddhism in France. The temple is located in Boulay and can be visited. You can also go there for an initiation course in Buddhism, meditation or yoga.

Castles always appeal to the imagination. A visit takes you immediately back in time. In the region, there are a number of them that are worth a visit. Château La Rochepot, de Sully, de Bazoches & de Couches are beautiful examples.

7. The music

The Morvan has a strong musical tradition. In spring, but especially in summer, various music festivals take place. This is also the case in Larochemillay. Classical, Jazz and other genres are represented.
